your choice.

find what connects with you...

Paper for Drawing Foundations:

newsprint pad 18x24"

Drawing A & B may also wish to have:

drawing paper 18x24" to work on

it is white, has a smoother tooth, and a more polished appearance when completed

Charcoal:

1 box soft willow or vine

1 box medium willow or vine

a box usually has 3 sticks.

Winsor & Newton is nice.

White:

1 General's "white charcoal"

usually comes 1 or 2 to a package

Eraser:

1-2 kneaded rubber eraser

1 cotton cloth rag (*old T shirt...*)

Drawing board:

optional.

studio e has boards you may use for class.

1 pre-made hardboard with clips

or 1 bare hardboard and 2 bull clamps

Practical supplies:

an old shirt or apron to wear when working

a pencil box or ziploc bag to keep supplies in

a water bottle,

cup of coffee...

*If you really want to get better at drawing,
buy a spiral sketchbook no bigger than 5x8"
hook a mechanical pencil into the spiral,
keep it with you (purse, briefcase, car),
and make 10 minute drawings whenever you
have a chance. Everything is game.*
